
Welcome!

Engagement work

community mural with Symon Mathieson, a street Artist from the area and they hope to use a site on Dundonald Street to create a mural. It was great to see our service users sharing their ideas with the young people.



On the 28th of February the Adult Literacy Team delivered a creative storybook project at the Toddlers, making story sacks and puppets. It was really enjoyed by both toddlers and their adults.



There was also another engaging workshop with Pam from the adult literacy team, which the toddlers and their adults enjoyed learning about nature and drawing the plants and animals and they seen.

We welcomed again in February The Adult Literacy Team from Dundee City Council who came into celebrate World Book Week and done arts and crafts with the Toddlers and adults from the Toddler Group.

Classes


Our Cooking on a Budget classes continued in February 2023, and many thanks to Linda Mill for hosting these and everyone has learned so much from these classes.



In February we also started up a Film Club that will run every Monday from 1.30 p.m. to 3 p.m. Refreshments are included.

We received funding to start up Drumming classes which started on the 9th of March and will run for 15 weeks. This class runs from 7.45 to 9.45 and 20 people attend the class. Drumming has a positive effect on anxiety, grief, fatigue, depression etc. Playing the drums can help people express themselves and get in touch with their emotional state.





On the 28th of February we held a Quiz night in the Fort Bar in Broughty Ferry to raise funds for Boomerang and Grey Lodge for the Grey Lodge Annual Prison break that was taking place on the 18^{th of} March 2023 where Alison and her team will be escaping from Perth Prison. Over £900 was raised on the evening with monies being split between Boomerang and the Grey Lodge Settlement. This



Prison break has been running for over 20 years and has raised thousands of pounds for Charity.

On Saturday the 4th of March we held our first ever Jumble Sale here at Kemback Street from 10am to 12 noon. This was organised by Sarah our Resource Worker. We had various items donated by members of the public and all the monies raised will go into the running of the Centre. There was good footfall through the door, and everyone had a great time. 
