The month of June saw Dundee University coming along and doing a project on "Food memories"

We held a fabulous Art Exhibition on the 29<sup>th</sup> of August where our adult art group were able to showcase their work over the past 12 months and also our children's Art class also highlighted the work they have been doing.



We also started our Family cooking sessions in August. This is for families to prepare healthy meals on a low budget. Kids classes also started in June 2023.



Transition Dundee Gleaning Project came along with a donation of lovely blackberries. Gleaning is the harvesting of produce that would otherwise been wasted. Sam made some lovely cakes and jam from the produce.

# Toddlers

Recently at Toddlers we have had lots of our little people move on to nursery, we have been so excited to hear about all their adventures and were so grateful to have been a part of their journey.

On the 15<sup>th of</sup> August we had Totstars come in to do a session with our families, we had a ball singing and dancing and jumping around, it was very engaging for the families and enabled the families to have a taster session of Totstars with some families going on to join their weekly groups.





We have recently gotten both our sensory room and arts and crafts rooms within toddlers ready, and they are now being used every session, they have been very popular and well-liked by our families as they encourage child led play and exploration. We also now have sorted a walk-in wardrobe for swapping children's clothes – this has also been well used by our families and we have been so grateful for all the donations we have had. One of the comments we received about our playgroup recently was that it is 'lifesaving'. We couldn't achieve this without the support of everyone at Boomerang as well as our families for coming along each session.





We are looking forward to our trip to Auchingarrich Wildlife Park on the 16<sup>th of</sup> October, this trip will be enjoyed by 25 families, we are so grateful to have received funding for this through Cash For Kids that allowed us to pay for transport as well as the entry fee for all children which means that we were able to keep the costs minimal to be accessible for more families.

We will also be having our toddlers Halloween party on the 31<sup>st of</sup> October, these events are always well attended by our families, and we look forward to all the fun we are going to have!

Going forward we would like to begin a voluntary parent and toddlers committee, where parents / guardians can meet to discuss things that they would like to see happening within toddlers and help to strengthen the relationship between staff, volunteers and the families who attend, we are looking to start recruiting for this in the next couple of weeks.



# **Summer Holiday Provisions**

In July and August, we had 6 weeks' worth of holiday activities for children, every Monday we had a trip and then the rest of the week we had films, games and arts and craft activities! These were well attended, and we were grateful to have received funding from Cash for Kids and Dundee Bairns that allowed us to make this provision free, as well as providing lunch for all our young people. We also have started a library within this group so families can donate, swap, and take away books to enjoy together, we even have little reward cards for the little people that get stamped every time they come! We are so grateful to The National Literacy Trust who gave us a donation of books for this group that are being enjoyed weekly by families!
