#### October

To kick off October, we had 5 pupils from Morgan Academy come along to our centre to do some volunteering for the week. Duties included helping in our Cosy Café serving some tea and toast but also having sit down conversations with our service users, which they loved, helping to serve our lovely hot lunch meals to service users but also helping to maintain the kitchen by doing dishes, putting rubbish out and sweeping the floor. All pupils were lovely and very engaged, we can't wait until we get the next bunch!

Some of the team participated in Community Sighted Guided Training within our centre, the ladies who ran the course were so patient and fab! This training showed us the different stages of blindness and we even got to try on some super cool glasses which let you see first hand how a person with that type of eyesight would be seeing the world. Towards the end of the training, we were paired up with another staff member to be guided around the building with our eyes closed, again was super fun and I loved how we all trusted one another in that scenario.



We had about 50 families attend our Family Halloween Party which is just amazing. Had lots of spooky activities which included "mummy wrapping" best costume and musical statues (which was soooo hard to judge, noone wanted be the bad guy, so we recruited the kids that were already out to help us decide which turned out to be so funny. All the families and kids (and the staff and volunteers too) had an amazing time and the feed back was great. I'm looking forward to this years Halloween party. (pictures are on Facebook)

November – On the 27th and 29th of November I attended a training course called VAW (Violence Against Women). This training was absolutely amazing, such an eye opener and it was great to learn so much but at the same time it was also very overwhelming and hard to watch or speak about certain topics but the group that attended were amazing and we all leaned on one another. I can't express how much I appreciate doing training like this- I'm so much more prepared should i need to deal with a related situation in the Centre.

We had a few 'Corporate' Volunteer days throughout this quarter, with B&Q, BT, EE and Insight all encouraging their staff to spend a couple of hours volunteering with us... as you can imagine, theres always plenty to do and in December, extra hands wrapping was a lifesaver!

December 4th I completed an 8 week course on the Open University around Understanding Autism which was very enjoyable to do and I've learned so much which again, I will put into practice within my role.

Our amazing Larder Volunteers served 216 different people over this time;
helping to support 1644 families with a food value of £18,566.25. Thank
you to Linda, 'Landa and Moira!

Thank you too to the team at Tail End who have been donating kids meals fortnightly for the larder which have gone down a treat, and delicious fish for our Lunch Club and Larder too!

We were also lucky enough to have selection boxes donated for our toddlers and youth parties- astoundingly, we had so many donated we were able to pass some onto other local charities and also give them out through our larder- the support we recieve is just phenomenal!





In October we got the exciting news that we had been successfully nominated by Morrisons Dundee and their Charity Champion to receive just over £6000 funding towards a revamp of our Cosy Cafe!

We are so grateful that we were put forward for this and delighted to have won! Work starts in January so our cafe will be in the Lunch Room for a week or two, but the distruption will be worth it for a fresh, fun new cafe!



November saw our Lunch Club Menu move into winter-warmers; mac n cheese, stovies and all our lovely soups are perfect for these colder months!

We did have a wee Autumn Afternoon Tea which was just lovely- the fancy crockery and bitesize foods are just a wee bit special and everyone had a great time!


# DEVELOPMENT
